Mr. Micka was 1st Sergeant of Company 'B', 15th Engineer Combat Battalion of the 9th Infantry Division of the U.S. Army. His first overseas stint began in North Africa under General Patton against General Rommel, helping to capture over 200,000 prisoners. His next mission was to help drive the Germans out of Sicily. He was then sent to England to reoutfit for the landing of the 9th Division on Utah Beach on D-Day plus 2. Ernie is proud to say he served from the first day of WWII to the last, being gone from home almost 5 years serving his country. #### LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

On behalf of the Honor Flight Bluegrass Board, we hope you and your family are doing well during these challenging times. We are diligently working behind the scenes so we can continue to serve our Veterans through missions and other events.

Our mission is to fly WWII, Korean War, and then Vietnam War Veterans in this order to Washington DC to see their Memorials, at no cost to them. Our most senior veterans have been patiently waiting for their turn to fly and we want to make this happen.

Due to the unforeseen circumstances our country is going through, and our desire to keep our Veterans safe, we cancelled our April 21st and June 2nd Honor Flights. Our remaining flight is scheduled on September 29th, and as for now, it is filled mainly with WWII and Korean War Veterans. We want to thank the Kentucky Veterans Trust Fund and Cynthia Shaw (deceased), as a part of her estate plan for sponsoring this flight.

We are heavily recruiting WWII and Korean War Veterans from across Kentucky and Southern Indiana who have not been on an Honor Flight. Time is of the essence and this is the least we can do to honor them. Furthermore, in honoring and paying tribute to the 75th Anniversary of the end of World War II, it is our duty to find ways to honor and serve our WWII Veterans. On May 8th, VE Day, it will be 75 years since German forces surrendered to the Allies. Over 400,000 members of the Greatest Generation paid the ultimate sacrifice to help win World War II.

With that said, we have added a WWII Veteran Wish Campaign this year. You will find details on pages 6-7 of this newsletter and on our website. As we all know, our WWII Veterans are from a humble generation, so please help us promote this Wish Campaign so we all get an opportunity to give back to them. Of the 16,000,000 men and women who served during WWII, approximately 300,000 remain.






# WWII VETERANS BOOK TO COMMEMORATE THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE END OF WWII
