

As we close our 15th year of flying, we are grateful for all the fantastic memories and times shared with our Veterans and volunteers.






BACK TO SCHOOL

PEARL HARBOR DAY

The United States lost 2,403 service members and civilians during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. In addition, 1,178 people were injured in the attack, which permanently sank two U.S. Navy battleships, the USS Arizona and the USS Utah, and destroyed 188 aircraft. We honor their sacrifice and all the members of the Greatest Generation who secured our freedom in WWII.

Everything was perfect from the air flights, places visited, the bus trips around D.C., the food, and certainly but not least, the guardian that was provided for me. My guardian was Cynthia Hilyerd. She was great. I found out her father had paid her way and my deepest gratitude to him for his generosity. I told Cynthia soon after we met that it was only after 911, over 30 years, before anyone had thanked me for my service. She could not thank me enough. By the end of the day as we disembarked from the plane I told her, she was special, the trip was special, and she made me feel special.

I am a Veteran that returned from Southeast Asia in late 1969. No one ever welcomed me home when I returned outside of my immediate family. I remember walking through the San Francisco airport in uniform and getting stares and weird looks from barefooted shirtless hippies. Needless to say, when we entered the waiting area at the Standiford airport and were greeted by what appeared to be thousands of people with the welcoming committee, I was blown away. I can not begin to tell you the number of people that spoke to me and said, "Welcome home." I responded and told them it was over 50 years and it was the first time anyone said that. It was humbling and awesome at the same time.

On my way home from the airport it made me think that perhaps that is the way it will be when one gets to heaven. All the people whose lives we've touched will be there waiting for us, cheering us on and thanking us for what we did for them. I know I will be in the crowd when anyone involved in the Honor Flight shows up and comes walking in.

Again, I can not say thank you enough and really can not put into words how much I appreciate having been a part of all of this. I know there must be individuals and corporate sponsors that must contribute to all of this. Please pass on my thanks and gratitude.
